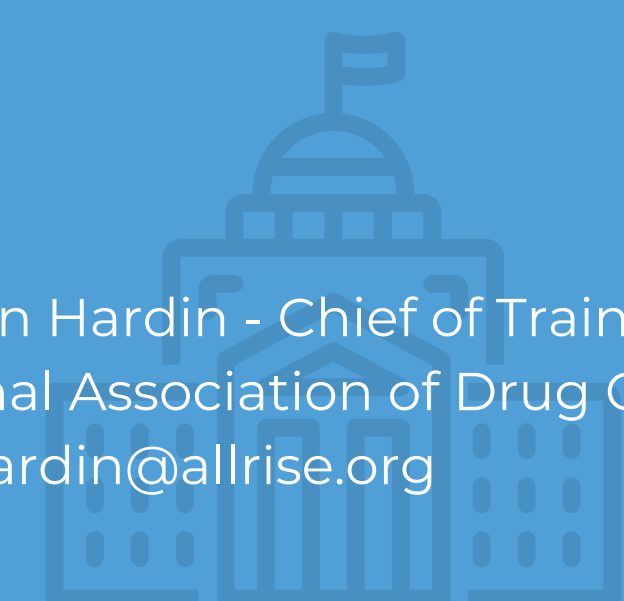


The National Drug Court Institute
